
## LEE FOOK CHEE'S HONG KONG 流光迅影香港情

PATRICIA CHIU 招璞君 EDWARD STOKES 艾思滔

Lee Fook Chee's Hong Kong was planned and originated by The Photographic Heritage Foundation. The book was researched and written by Patricia Chiu, in collaboration with Edward Stokes. The texts were written in English, and later translated by Jennifer Chan into the Chinese.

Patricia Chiu is a Hong Kong historian. She obtained her doctorate at Girton College, the University of Cambridge. Patricia has taught at the Chinese University of Hong Kong and the University of Hong Kong, where she is an Honorary Institute Fellow at the Hong Kong Institute for the Humanities and Social Sciences. For her research uncovering the histories of mission schools, and the life stories of women and men from all walks of life, besides archival documentary materials she has also widely consulted oral history and photographic sources. She contributes to the Hong Kong Memory website, and is the author of *A History of the Grant Schools Council: Vision, Mission, and Transformation*, published in 2013.

Edward Stokes is a photographer, writer and publisher. An Australian, he grew up in Hong Kong. He studied at Magdalen College, Oxford. Edward later completed five photo-led books on Australian history and exploration. He returned to Hong Kong in 1993, to photograph and write *Hong Kong's Wild Places*, an acclaimed account of 'man' and 'land'. He later completed other books on the local landscape. After the 2005 publication of *Hedda Morrison's Hong Kong*, together with others he established The Photographic Heritage Foundation.

The Photographic Heritage Foundation, a not-for-profit body, publishes little-known historical photographs of Asia, and contemporary images of urban landscapes and nature settings.

《流光迅影香港情》是歷史遺珍攝影基金會的作品。本書由招璞君 與艾思滔合作搜集資料及以英語撰寫,其後由陳杏如翻譯中文。

招璞君是香港歷史學者,劍橋大學格頓學院博士。曾於香港中文 大學及香港大學任教,現為香港大學香港人文社會研究所名譽研 究員。她致力研究教會學校歷史和香港人文故事,除詳細探閱歷 史檔案,亦廣泛搜羅口述歷史和昔日相片作資源材料。招璞君 曾為「香港記憶」網站提供資料,2013年撰著 A History of the Grant Schools Council: Vision, Mission, and Transformation一書。

**艾思**酱是攝影家、作家和出版人。原籍澳洲的他在香港長大,後 往英國求學,畢業於牛津大學馬達連學院,先後撰寫五本以澳洲 為素材的著作。1993年他重回香港定居,撰寫了《山水有情》一 書,收錄個人攝影作品。這本訴說人與大自然關係的刊物廣獲好 評。艾思滔其後並出版多本香港自然風景書籍。2005年出版《逝 影留踪》後,他與多位聯合創辦人成立歷史遺珍攝影基金會。
